Pierz E-Learning Day Plan (Canceled School Day) 2023-2024 Pierz School District #484

In the Event of a School Closing, Pierz School District #484, will run an E-Learning Day for teachers and students.

- No more than 5 days total per school year.
- If there is a 2 hour late start that turns into a snow day, parents will be notified by 6:20 if we are changing to an E- Learning day.
- The district will identify E-Learning days through announcements.
- If the postponement is determined after 6:20 AM the morning of, no E-Learning Day will be allowed due to statute and a student contact day may be added to the school year if state revenue is being impacted by the missed student time.
- If, after, 5 E-Learning Days are implemented, the School Board may determine to add additional student days if state revenue is being impacted by the missed student time.

Purpose: Utilize blended learning strategies and technology tools to provide a continuation of learning, thus minimizing the disruption to academic progress that is caused by emergency school closures. While E-Learning Days cannot replace face-to-face instruction, it is a way that staff and students can continue moving forward with their current content.

Implementation Plan: The following steps and procedures will occur on an E- Learning Day:

Teachers will:

- Teachers will post detailed expectations for the day by 9:00 am. Where the information will be located will be communicated prior to utilizing an E-Learning Day.
 - All E-Learning plans are available on the district website under Our Schools/Pioneer Elementary or Healy/E-Learning Day Plan.

- Teachers will design E- Learning day assignments with realistic expectations, timelines and consideration regarding students' workload. Students should expect about 15-20 minutes of work per class.
- Teacher prep time for the E- Learning day will be from 7:30 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. including paraprofessionals.
- Teachers will be available via email and voicemail during the E- Learning Day from 9:00 a.m. 3:30 p.m. Teachers are allowed a duty free lunch.
- Teachers will provide a certain amount of flexibility/accommodations for students unable to work from home (when contacted by the student). Teachers will accept completed student work on the E- Learning Day to account for attendance.
- K-4 students will turn in their packets at the beginning of the day following the E-Learning day.
- Special education staff will work with students on an IEP to provide accommodations as warranted in their plan, based upon that child's activities on that date.
- Paraprofessionals will be assigned by Principals and communicate with teachers to determine what students receive additional academic support. Students will have access to support via paraprofessional's classroom meeting, teacher assigned breakout room or email.

Students will:

- Participate in E- Learning Day activities.
- Complete the E- Learning Day activities in a timely manner and on the day of instruction while the teacher is available. This counts as a regular school day.
- Contact the teacher via email (on the E- Learning Day) if a student is unable to complete E- Learning activities on the E- Learning day (internet difficulties, etc.)
- Elementary student work on the E- Learning Day must be completed and turned in on the next school day. Failure to complete and turn in work from an E-Learning day may result in the student considered Absent on that date.
- Middle and high school student work on the E- Learning Day must be completed and turned in on the E-Learning school day. Failure to complete and turn in work from an E-Learning day may result in the student considered Absent on that date.
- Notify each of your teachers via email if they do not have internet on the E- Learning Day. All work must still be completed in order to meet attendance requirements.
- Communicate questions for teachers via email, voicemail, and Google classroom. Teachers will be available from 9:00-3:30 to answer questions.

Parents will:

- I will help my child with E- Learning Day activities if they need help or help my child email the teacher for clarification.
- I will remind my child to complete E- Learning Day activities on the E- Learning Day.
- I will contact the school, and have my student(s) contact their teachers, on the E-Learning Day if the internet is unavailable or it will be an unexcused absence.

Other Expectations:

• All staff who work under the Teacher Contract must submit an E- Learning Day Action Plan to the building principal by 9:00 am.
